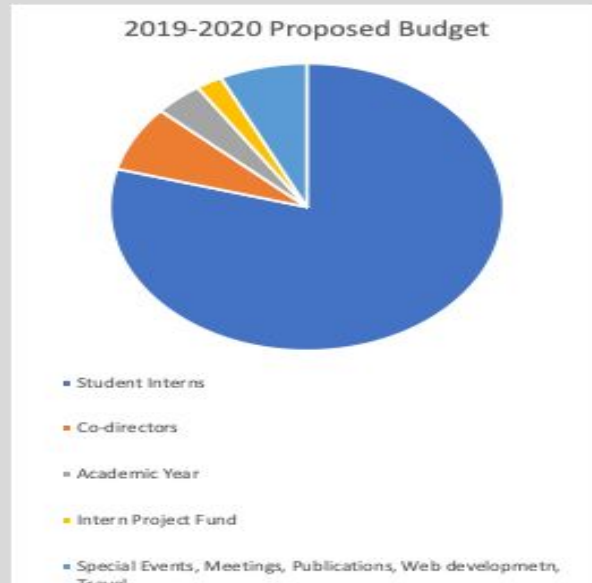

Urban Health Project Annual Report 2020

As UHP's 33rd summer comes to an end, we would like to thank and congratulate our interns for continuing in the greatness of their predecessors. We would also like to express how much of an honor and privilege it was to serve as co-directors. As Co-directors, we had the privilege of helping UHP continue to grow and to witness the impact it has in the community. Through the interns, UHP continued to not only grow, but also to model active compassion for the underserved.



In the summer of 2019, UHP placed 20 interns with 19 community partners spread across Southwestern Ohio and Northern Kentucky. Our interns worked with many different populations representing the diverse spectrum of our community. Over the course of eight weeks, our interns provided over 4,800 hours of service directly impacting over 2,400 individuals. **UHP interns developed new projects aimed at quality improvement and community service.** For example, interns taught kids the importance of nutrition and good hand hygiene, ran workshops on healthy cooking and exercise for women in shelters, and organized health fairs for migrant workers.

In 2020, UHP continues to grow and impact the community in spite of the challenges COVID-19 presented. We have been able to form new partnerships, strengthened old connections and recruited a new class of interns motivated to carry on the legacy of compassion. In 2020, interns have continued to volunteer with their sites, carried on research and presented at national conferences. We have passed on the torch to a new group of interns with 2 highly capable and passionate Co-directors to help UHP strive to reach new heights. We are excited to witness new developments and encourage continued excellence. All of this could not have been done without the guidance of our advisory board and the support of our alumni and funders. Therefore, thank you for your commitment to community and the mission of UHP.

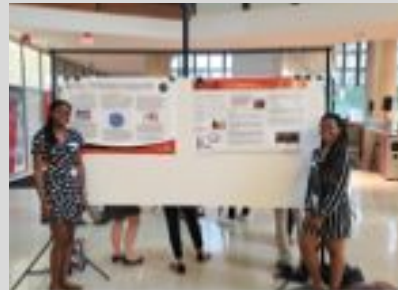

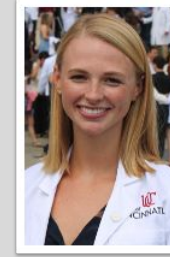
